PENNEKAMP PBIS – EXAMPLES OF WHEN A BEHAVIOR NOTICE MIGHT BE ISSUED:

Defiance/Disrespect/Non-Compliance/ Refusal to follow directions or instructions (M – Disrespect)

Definition: Student engages in brief or low-intensity failure to respond to adult requests.

Examples: Non-responsive, off task in classroom, eye rolling, “whatever”, refusing to follow directions, ignoring, “I don’t want to”, “You’re not the boss of me”, gum chewing, talking in class, eating in class, talking back.

Disruption/Disruptive Horseplay (M – Disruption)

Definition: Student is disturbing other students or teacher during class time. Student engages in low-intensity, but inappropriate disruption.

Examples: Side conversations, note passing, tapping fingers or pencil, outburst, blurts out answers without raising hand, gets out of seat without permission, slamming books on desk, playing with things, whistling, humming, clowning around.

Dress Code Violation (M – Dress)

Definition: Student wears clothing that is not safe for school.

Examples: Students come to class in sandals without a back strap, Crocs, or attire with inappropriate language.

Inappropriate Language (M – Inapp Lan)

Definition: Low level instance of inappropriate language. Accidental slip of inappropriate language, poor choice of words used in common areas/classroom/during a game, non-directed verbal assault, hand gestures. Implied meaning without literal verbiage.

Tease/Taunt (M – Other)

Definition: Student uses choice vocabulary to make fun of another student.

Example: “I won and you didn’t.”

Confiscation (M – Confiscation)

Definition: Student engages in inappropriate use of cell phone, mp3 player, camera, smart watch or computer. Could also be toy-like items brought to school without teacher permission.

Example: Using cell phone to text/call without permission, trinkets or toys brought to school, communicating on smart watch

Physical Contact (M – Contact)

Definition: Student engages in non-serious/non-injury unwanted physical contact.

Example: Playful contact (girls hitting boys and vice versa), chasing, rough housing, tackling as part of a game
pushing in line, jumping, poking, kicking under the table.

Property Misuse (M – Prpty Misuse)

Definition: Student is not using tools and supplies for their intended purpose

Example: Changing computer settings, pounding on keyboard, breaking pencils, using paper for origami, doodles, or air planes without teacher permission.

Other (M – Other) Student engages in any other minor problem behaviors that do not fall within the above.

PENNEKAMP PBIS – EXAMPLES OF WHEN A BEHAVIOR CITATION MIGHT BE ISSUED:

Unacceptable Language/Profanity

Definition: Student delivers verbal messages that include swearing, name calling, or use of words in an inappropriate way

Examples: Swear words, racial slurs, and sexual comments

Fighting/Physical Aggression

Definition: - Student engages in actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur. A loss of temper resulting in property damage and/or intimidation of another student.

Examples: - Hitting, punching, hitting with an object, hair pulling, scratching, and kicking. Throwing objects, threatening, pounding on furniture, etc.

Overt Defiance/Disrespect

Definition: Student engages in refusal to follow directions, talks back, or delivers socially rude interactions.

Examples: Blatant disregard for teacher instructions, student continues to disregard even after teacher interventions.

Harassment

Definition: Student delivers disrespectful message to another student.

Examples: Negative comments

Bullying

Definition: Bullying is an aggressive behavior that involves the intent to cause emotional or physical harm. Bullying can be physical, verbal, or social/relational and may involve a *single severe act* or *repetition* or *potential repetition* of a deliberate act.

Cyberbullying includes the creation of harassing communications, direct threats, or other harmful texts, sounds, images, or spreading rumors. Cyberbullying also includes using another person's log-in credentials to alter the account or impersonate.

Examples: Text messages, emails, negative comments based on gender, race, religion, limitations, or other personal matters.

Damage to school property Damage to property not belonging to you

Definition: Student destroys or defaces school property or property belonging to another student or staff member.

Examples: Student kicks in the restroom stall door, carves into a desk/table, breaks something purposefully **Other** Stealing/theft, arson, graffiti, etc.
